Book Groups:

Adult: We gather each month to discuss a book. Copies are available the month before the book group.

Teens: Kids (7th-12th grades) gather each month to discuss a book; activities or projects pertinent to the book happen as time allows. Copies are available the month before the book group.

Tween Book Group: Kids (4th-6th grades) gather each month to discuss a book; activities or projects pertinent to the book happen as time allows. Copies are available the month before the book group.

Family Board Games: Just as the name suggests—time for families to come and play board games together here at the library!

Knit & Crochet Club:

Novices and experts alike—join us for some time to chat while working on projects; bring your own supplies, we'll provide the room and snacks!

Lego-palooza: Stop by and build whatever creations come to mind. Legos will be supplied.

Movies: You bring a drink (w/a lid please!) and we'll provide a snack and the movie!

Playdate: Though geared toward the 2-5 year old crowd, any of the younger kiddos are welcome too—time for the kids to play and interact with one another and parents to chat. We provide the space and toys, we'll see you there!
