## PRODUCTION STAFF BIOGRAPHIES

Ameera Ansari (costume designer) is Ohio Northern University's costume shop manager and resident designer. She costume-coordinates The ONU Holiday Spectacular and Choreographers Showcase spring dance performance every year. Also, she designed for the 2018 production of Sweet Charity; the 2017 productions of Carrie: The Musical and Hayavadana in spring 2019. Ansari holds an MFA in costume design from Illinois State University and a BA from Pennsylvania State University. She came from Eastern University, located outside the suburbs of Philadelphia, where she was costume shop manager and resident designer. She has worked for other institutions, such as The People's Light & Theatre Company, Illinois Shakespeare Festival, Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival, Ursinus College, and The Savoy Opera. Ansari has worked as a freelance designer in theatre and dance for eight years, designing for such productions as Wonderful Town; Godspell; Bell, Book, and Candle; Good Person of Szechwan; Noises Off; Our Town; The Centurion; and Twelfth Night.

Ashley Buersmeyer (choreographer) graduated from Kent State University with a BFA in dance performance and choreography. Throughout her college career, she was given the opportunity to perform a self-choreographed solo at the American College Dance Association in Kalamazoo, Mich., choreograph for the Student Dance Festival and BFA Senior Concert, and take part in the East Meets West Collaborative Exchange. Through this exchange, Buersmeyer traveled to Bangkok and Hua Hin, Thailand, to perform in two concerts as well as teach an Improvisation into Choreography master class to American and Thai students. From this experience, she was able to present research on the collaboration between American and Thai students within East Meets West at undergraduate and graduate research symposiums through Kent State University. Buersmeyer was a member of the Kent Dance Ensemble, a pre-professional dance company that performed and provided outreach opportunities in the Northeast Ohio area. She has also worked with Cleveland's The Movement Project in intensives and professional performances. Buersmeyer taught for Kinderdance of Columbus after graduating from college. She is now teaching at The Arts Center School of Music and Dance and is an adjunct dance instructor at Ohio Northern University.

Elizabeth Cozad-Howard (choreographer) is the director of dance at Ohio Northern University. She holds a BFA in dance from Wright State University and danced with the WSU Dance Ensemble and is currently working toward her MFA in dance at Saint Mary's College of California. Liz started her teaching career with the Dayton Ballet School and Lyn's Academy of Dance. Her love of classical training and concert dance has led her to promote ballet and modern dance in our younger generations. Collaborating with our annual Choreographers Showcαse, she coordinates ONU's Day of Dance for local high school age dancers. She has performed with the ONU Dance Ensemble with Gus Giordano and with Jazz, Blues and Dance II. Liz choreographed "Falling" ('14), "Phases" ('15), "Only the Winds" ('17), "The Chase" ('17), "No Roots" ('18), and "Roots and Wings" ('19) for the ONU Dance Ensemble. In collaboration with our Department of Music, she has choreographed "El Camino Real," "Sparke Dance Movements" and "Persichetti Movements." "El Camino Real" was awarded the 2014 Ohio Federation of Music Club Scholarship for collaboration of choreography and performance with a live orchestra.

**Kathleen DeVault** (lighting designer; production manager) is currently head of ONU's international theatre production program. She earned a BA in theatre/English from Ohio State University and an MFA in lighting and sound design from the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. Before coming to ONU, she was the resident lighting designer at Smith College and did freelance lighting and sound design for various companies, including Natarjii Dance Company, Chrysalis Theatre, New Century Theatre and the Drama Studio. At ONU, DeVault has designed lights and sound for many productions, including *Elysium*, *Picnic*, *Magic Flute*, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, *Tommy* and *Cαrousel*. She has lit all the

International Play Festivals and served as scenic and sound designer for a few. DeVault has also designed lights for the Wellington School in Columbus, Ohio, (musical Tater Tots of Love) and Columbus Children's Theatre (Xanadu Jr., Willy Wonka Kids, Mary Poppins Jr., Cinderella Kids and 13). She did the lighting and sound design for Freed Purple Monkey's production of A Matter of Choice at the New York Fringe Festival. DeVault is national president of Theta Alpha Phi and chairperson of the USITT/Ohio Valley section. Outside of theatre, DeVault is a 4-H club advisor and a proud member of the Logan County Junior Fair Poultry Committee.

**Lilli Kantonen** (assistant stage manager) is a junior philosophy, politics and economics (PPE) major and theatre technology and design minor from Lima, Ohio.

**Camryn Lamontagne** (choreographer) is a freshman musical theatre major from Austin, Texas. She is a proud Actor's Equity Association member who previously performed with ZACH Pre-Professional Company, IMPACT Dance Company and Ballet Austin. She earned her Master's Degree in education with a concentration in music from the University of Louisville in 2008. Along her career, she has taught studio dance across all disciplines. In 2016, she moved back to Ohio with her husband, David, BSBA '97, and her two children. She is currently an adjunct professor of theatre at Kent State University. She is the owner/instructor of Studio S Stage and Performing Arts which offers instruction in music, theatre and dance. She is honored and excited to be back at ONU and working with these talented students.

Jillian Peterson (choreographer) is a performer, choreographer and dance instructor from Baltimore, Md. She has earned her BA in dance from Slippery Rock University where she focused on modern dance technique and choreography. There, Peterson performed in student, faculty and guest artist works featured in numerous concerts including the American College Dance Festival. In the summer of 2008, Peterson traveled to Chennai, India, to study Bhratanatyam with master guru, Revathi Ramachandran. Peterson previously performed with ReVision dance company, the resident modern company at Dance Place in Washington D.C., for five years. Aside from performing, ReVision focuses on working with all age groups in the D.C. community as well as teens and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Currently, Peterson performs with the internationally acclaimed Bollywood dance company Mystic India: The World Tour. She has toured internationally, performing at prestigious venues and danced with Bollywood stars. This is Jillian's second year working with Ohio Northern University students. In 2019, she visited with Mystic India to teach students a Bollywood number, who were able to perform with the company. Jillian is glad to be back on campus bringing a brand new piece "Bathwater" for the ONU students to debut.

**Brian Phillips** (technical director), BA '97, graduated from ONU with a BA in communication arts-theatre and a minor in industrial technology. He earned his MFA in technical direction from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts. Prior to returning to ONU, Phillips served as technical director for the Goodman Theatre in Chicago where he worked on more than 30 world-premiere productions. In addition to his role as Freed Center Technical Director, he has been the scenic designer for multiple productions at ONU, including *Dancing at Lughnasa*, *Edges* and *Romeo and Juliet*. Phillips has continued his professional work,

returning to the Goodman as technical supervisor for *The Jungle Book* in 2013, as technical director of *The White Snake* touring to China in 2014, and as technical supervisor for *War Paint* starring Patti LuPone and Christine Ebersole in 2016. Phillips, an ETCP-certified theatrical rigger, became an associate trainer with Chicago Flyhouse in 2017, providing training and equipment inspections throughout the world for companies such as Royal Caribbean, Celebrity Cruises, and Cirque du Soleil.
