Hardin Leadership is committed to developing positive leaders within Hardin County through providing personal enrichment, expanding community networks, and recognizing future leaders. The Steering Committee recommends that the participant offer to pay \$25.00 of the tuition fee as an indication of their commitment to participating in the program.
