Re: Committee discussion for proposed safety improvements for the intersection of Buckeye and Main Street.

Committee, during my May 17<sup>th</sup> Council report I had mentioned that I would like to call for a committee meeting for discussion on improving the safety of the Buckeye and Main Street intersection by making East Buckeye one-way traffic heading east from Main to Johnson. Another benefit would be an increase of parking spaces in that area. I had informed Council that I would have Choice One Engineering do a safety evaluation of the intersection with comparison of the current traffic flow to a one-way traffic flow. I have attached the summary of that evaluation along with drawings showing conflict points (currently 32 that would be reduced to 20 with one-way traffic). The evaluation also showed a visibility concern as well as a drawing of angled parking on the north side of E Buckeye with an increase of 7 parking spaces.

## **Topics for discussion:**

Does the intersection of Buckeye and Main need safety improvement?
Is the proposed one-way east traffic pattern from Main to Johnson a solution?
Should angle parking be considered if east Buckeye becomes one-way?
Should we include west Buckeye in the discussion of one-way traffic as well?
(Gilbert to Main, Main to Johnson all east bound one-way – COE says will reduce contact points even more)

Should we also add angle parking to west Buckeye if it becomes one-way? (Would suggest no parking from 2am – 6:00 am for angle parking, parallel parking allowed overnight for downtown apartments)

Action would require signage and pavement marking Would ask for motion, resolution, or ordinance if we proceed?

Safety research suggest that intersections crash rates are related to the number of conflict points at the intersection. **Conflict points** are locations in or on the approaches to an intersection where vehicles paths merge, diverge, or cross.

Good evening Jamie,

Attached are some exhibits we pulled together to show the possibility of making East Buckeye Avenue a one way east bound street from Main Street to Johnson Street.

The first attachment "East Buckeye Concept-002" shows what the parking layout could be. The street is not wide enough to put angle parking on both sides, but we would recommend putting 45 degree angle parking on the north side and keeping the parallel parking on the south side.

The next three exhibits all relate to how making East Buckeye one way eastbound will make the intersection of Buckeye and Main safer.

- "East Buckeye Concept site plan Conflict-Ex." This shows how many points of conflict that could result in vehicle crashes there are with all four approaches being two way (32 conflict points)
- "East Buckeye Concept site plan Conflict-Prop." This shows how many points of conflict that could result in vehicle crashes there are with East Buckeye being one way east bound (20 conflict points). There are 12 less points of conflict by removing the westbound traffic which would suggest making that block one way would make the intersection safer.
- "East Buckeye Concept site plan SightDistance" Shows that for west bound traffic on East Buckeye, the appropriate site distance for a vehicle to know if it is safe to enter the intersection is NOT currently provided. The first three parking spaces in front of El Campo block the safe view of a driver stopped at the intersection going westbound.

In summary, we believe making East Buckeye Street a one way street eastbound between Main and Johnson will make the intersection safer, as it reduces the number of potential conflict points and removes the concern of sight obstruction for westbound traffic. A one-way eastbound East Buckeye street would also allow for an added benefit of more on-street parking than what currently exists in this block.

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
