RESOLUTION 2023-31

A RESOLUTION CONSENTING TO THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF HARDIN COUNTY, OHIO AND WILSON SPORTING GOODS COMPANY, FOR THE ADOPTION OF A PROJECT WHICH WILL PROVIDE FOR EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN THE VILLAGE'S ENTERPRISE ZONE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas, the Village of Ada has heretofore consented to the establishment of an enterprise zone by the Board of Commissioners of Hardin County, Ohio as authorized by law, and

Whereas, Wilson Sporting Goods Company has proposed a project which will involve new infrastructure and employment within the enterprise zone in the village and improve the economic climate of the village and county and the Enterprise Zone Committee and Tax Incentive Review Committee have reviewed the progress and recommended to the terms of agreements attached as Exhibit "A." and Exhibit "B"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ADA, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Village of Ada hereby consents to and recommends the approval of the enterprise zone agreement by and between the Board of Commissioners of Hardin County, Ohio, and Wilson Sporting Goods, upon the conditions recommended by the Enterprise Zone Committee and by the Tax Incentive Review Committee.

SECTION 2. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, the particular necessity being the need to enable the parties to immediately enter into an enterprise zone agreement. Therefore, this Resolution shall go into immediate effect.

EXHIBIT A

OHIO ENTERPRISE ZONE AGREEMENT

This agreement made and entered into by and between the Village of Ada, Hardin County, Ohio, a political subdivision duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Ohio, with its main offices located at 115 W. Buckeye Ada, Ohio (hereinafter referred to as "VILLAGE") and the Board of Commissioners of Hardin County, a political subdivision duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Ohio with its main offices located at One Courthouse Square Suite 100, Kenton, Ohio (hereafter referred to as "Hardin County") and Wilson Sporting Goods Co., with its factory offices in Hardin County currently located at 217 Liberty St. Ada, OH 43316 (hereinafter referred to as "Wilson Sporting Goods"), WITNESSETH;

WHEREAS, The Village and Hardin County have encouraged the development of real property and the acquisition of personal property located in the area designated as an Enterprise Zone; and

WHEREAS, Wilson Sporting Goods is desirous of constructing a new eighty thousand (80,000) square foot facility for manufacturing to expand its football manufacturing operations (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT") within the boundaries of the aforementioned Enterprise Zone, provided that the appropriate development incentives are available to support the economic viability of said PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Hardin County, Ohio by Resolution No. V43-59 adopted February 3, 1989, designated the area as an "Enterprise Zone" pursuant Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and the zone was subsequently amended by Resolution No.V-54-193, adopted by the Hardin County Commissioners on February 8, 1996; and

WHEREAS, effective the 15th day of February 1989, the Director of Development of the State of Ohio determined that the aforementioned area designated in said Resolution contains the characteristics set forth in O.R.C. §5709.61(A) of the Ohio Revised Code and certified said area as an Enterprise Zone under said Chapter 5709; and

WHEREAS, The Village and Hardin County having the appropriate authority for the stated type of project is desirous of providing Wilson Sporting Goods with incentives available for the development of the PROJECT in said Enterprise Zone under Chapter 5709 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, Wilson Sporting Goods has submitted a proposed agreement application (herein attached as Exhibit A) to The Village and Hardin County Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "APPLICATION"); and

WHEREAS, Wilson Sporting Goods has remitted the required state application fee of \$750.00 made payable to the Ohio Department of Development with the application to be forwarded with the final agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Enterprise Negotiation Committee have investigated the application of Wilson Sporting Goods and has recommended approval of the same to the Village and the Board of Commissioners of Hardin County on the basis that Wilson Sporting Goods is qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities in said Enterprise Zone and improve the economic climate of The Village and Hardin County; and

WHEREAS, the project site as proposed by Wilson Sporting Goods is located at or adjacent to 217 Liberty St. Ada, OH 43316 in the Village of Ada Exempted School District and the Apollo Career Center and the Board of Education of the respective School Districts have been notified in accordance with O.R.C. §5709.83 and O.R.C. §5709.62(D) and been given a copy of the APPLICATION;

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.R.C. §5709.62(C), §5709.63(A) or §5709.632 and in conformance with the format required under O.R.C. §5709.631, the parties hereto desire to set forth their agreement with respect to matters hereinafter contained;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter contained and the benefit to be derived by the parties from the execution hereof, the parties herein agree as follows:

1. Wilson Sporting Goods shall construct a new eighty thousand (80,000) square foot facility for manufacturing to expand its football manufacturing operations. The new facility will be located at or adjacent to 217 Liberty St. Ada, OH 43316.

In addition, Wilson Sporting Goods will purchase and install approximately \$3,500,000 worth of new machinery and equipment and \$1,500,000 in furniture and fixtures.

The PROJECT will begin in May, 2023, and all acquisition, construction and installation is scheduled to be completed by May, 2024.

The total investment of this expansion project is greater than 10% of the market value of the property today.

2. In total Wilson Sporting Goods currently has 145 full-time employees and 3 part-time employees in the State of Ohio.

Wilson Sporting Goods shall create within a time period not exceeding 36 months after the commencement of operation of the aforesaid facility as specified below, the equivalent of 20 full-time permanent job opportunities.

This increase in the number of employees will result in approximately \$1,200,000 of additional annual payroll for Wilson Sporting Goods. The following is an itemization by the type of new jobs created: 20 full-time permanent positions amounting to \$1,200,000.

Wilson Sporting Good's schedule for hiring is as follows: create 5 new full-time permanent jobs in year one; 10 new full-time permanent jobs in year two; 5 new full-time permanent jobs in year three. The job creation period begins July, 2024, and all jobs will be in place by June, 2027.

- 3. Wilson Sporting Goods shall provide to the proper Tax Incentive Review Council any information reasonably required by the council to evaluate the enterprise's compliance with the agreement, including returns filed pursuant to O.R.C. §5711.02 as requested by the council.
- 4. The Village and Hardin County hereby grant a tax exemption for eligible new real property improvements made to the PROJECT site pursuant to pursuant O.R.C. §5709.62, 5709.63 or 5709.632 and shall be in the following amount:

100% exemption for 15 years. Each identified project improvement will receive a fifteenyear exemption period from the date of the expansion completion that occurs within the same time of the commencement of this PROJECT on May, 2023, through May, 2024.

5. The Village and Hardin County hereby grant a 100% tax exemption for 15 years for PROJECT pursuant to O.R.C. §5709.62, §5709.63, §5709.632 and shall be in the following amounts:

The exemption commences the first year for which the newly constructed facility on the real property would first be taxable were that property not exempted from taxation. No exemption shall commence after year 15 (fifteen) nor extend beyond year 15 (fifteen).

Each identified project improvement will receive a fifteen-year exemption period.

Wilson Sporting Goods must file the appropriate tax forms (DTE 24) with the County Auditor and (#913) with the State Department of Taxation to effect and maintain the exemptions covered in the agreement. The #913 Ohio tax form must be filed annually.

6. Wilson Sporting Goods shall pay an annual fee equal to the greater of one percent of the dollar value of incentives offered under the agreement or five hundred dollars: provided, however, that if the value of the incentives exceeds two hundred fifty thousand dollars, the fee shall not exceed two thousand five hundred dollars.

The fee shall be made payable to Hardin County once per year for each year the agreement is effective in the month of March in the form of a check. The fee is to be paid to the Hardin County Auditor, made out to the Hardin County Treasurer. This fee shall be deposited in a special fund created for such purpose and shall be used exclusively for the purpose of complying with O.R.C. §5709.68 and by the tax incentive review council created under O.R.C. §5709.85 exclusively for the purposes of performing the duties prescribed under that section.

- 7. Wilson Sporting Goods shall pay such real and tangible personal property taxes as are not exempted under this agreement and are charged against such property and shall file all tax reports and returns as required by law. If Wilson Sporting Goods fails to pay such taxes or file such returns and reports, all incentives granted under this agreement are rescinded beginning with the year for which such taxes are charged or such reports or returns are required to be filed and thereafter.
- 8. The Village and Hardin County shall perform such acts as are reasonably necessary or appropriate to effect, claim, reserve, and maintain exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement including, without limitation, joining in the execution of all documentation and providing any necessary certificates required in connection with such exemptions.
- 9. If for any reason the Enterprise Zone designation expires, the Director of the Ohio Department of Development revokes certification of the zone, or The Village or Hardin County revokes the designation of the zone, entitlements granted under this agreement shall continue for the number of years specified under this agreement, unless Wilson Sporting Goods materially fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement and The Village and Hardin County terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement.
- 10. If Wilson Sporting Goods materially fails to fulfill its obligations under this agreement, other than with respect to the number of employee positions estimated to be created or retained under this agreement, or if The Village or Hardin County determine that the certification as to delinquent taxes required by this agreement is fraudulent, The Village or Hardin County may terminate or modify the exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement, and may require the repayment of the amount of taxes that would have been

payable had the property noy been exempted from taxation under this agreement for each year in which the abatement was taken.

- 11. Wilson Sporting Goods hereby certifies that at the time this agreement is executed, Wilson Sporting Goods does not owe any delinquent real or tangible personal property taxes to any taxing authority of the State of Ohio and does not owe delinquent taxes for which Wilson Sporting Goods is liable under Chapter 5733., 5735., 5739., 5741., 5743., 5747., or 5753. of the Revised Code, or, if such delinquent taxes are owed, Wilson Sporting Goods currently is paying the delinquent taxes pursuant to an undertaking enforceable by the State of Ohio or an agent or instrumentality thereof, has filed a petition in bankruptcy under 11 U.S.C.A. 101, et seq., or such a petition has been filed against Wilson Sporting Goods. For the purposes of the certification, delinquent taxes are taxes that remain unpaid on the latest day prescribed for payment without penalty under the chapter of the O.R.C. governing payment of those taxes.
- 12. Wilson Sporting Goods affirmatively covenants that it does not owe: (1) any delinquent taxes to the State of Ohio or a political subdivision of the State; (2) any moneys to the State or a state agency for the administration or enforcement of any environmental laws of the State; and (3) any other moneys to the State, a state agency or a political subdivision of the State that are past due, whether the amounts owed are being contested in a court of law or not.
- 13. Wilson Sporting Goods and The Village and Hardin County acknowledge that this agreement must be approved by formal action of the legislative authority of The Village and Hardin County as a condition for the agreement to take effect. This agreement takes effect upon such approval.
- 14. The Village and Hardin County have developed a policy to ensure recipients of Enterprise Zone tax benefits practice non-discriminating hiring in its operations. By executing this agreement, Wilson Sporting Goods is committing to following nondiscriminating hiring practices acknowledging that no individual may be denied employment solely on the basis of race, religion, sex, disability, color, national origin, or ancestry.
- 15. Exemptions from taxation granted under this agreement shall be revoked if it is determined that Wilson Sporting Goods, any successor enterprise, or any related member (as those terms are defined in O.R.C. §5709.61) has violated the prohibition against entering into this agreement under of O.R.C. §3735.6(E) or §5709.62, §5709.63, or 5§709.632 to the time prescribed by that division or either of those sections.
- 16. Wilson Sporting Goods affirmatively covenants that it has made no false statements to the State or local political subdivision in the process of obtaining approval for the Enterprise Zone incentives. If any representative of Wilson Sporting Goods has knowingly made a false statement to the State or local political subdivision to obtain the Enterprise Zone incentives, Wilson Sporting Goods shall be required to immediately return all benefits received under the Enterprise Zone Agreement pursuant to ORC Section 9.66 (C)(2) and shall be ineligible for any future economic development assistance from the State, any state agency or a political subdivision pursuant to ORC Section 9.66(C)(1). Any person who provides a false statement to secure economic development assistance may be guilty of falsification, a misdemeanor of the first degree, pursuant to ORC 2921.13(D)(1), which is punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000 and/or a term of imprisonment of not more than six months.

- 17. This agreement is not transferrable or assignable without the express, written approval of The Village and Hardin County Board of Commissioners.
- 18. Additional understandings: The Village and Hardin County have estimated to Wilson Sporting Goods that such tax exemption may result in an estimated tax savings to Wilson of approximately \$75,000 per year for 15 years related to the newly constructed facility, provided Wilson Sporting Goods fulfills its obligations under this agreement. Apart from the tax exemption granted herein, the ongoing real property taxes to which the Wilson factory properties in Ada, OH may continue to be subject, are as follows: approximately \$13,170 per year in property taxes and approximately \$1,425 per year in special assessments based on current appraised values and rates of taxation on Wilson's current properties and improvements in Ada, OH. The approval required under Section 13 above is expected to occur on or about May 16, 2023. Wilson Sporting Goods shall have no liabilities for failure to fulfill its obligations under this agreement other than the repayment of the amount of taxes that would have been payable had the newly constructed facility not been exempted from taxation under this agreement for each year in which the abatement was taken, and for the payment of any unpaid taxes as of the current date, if any.

ENTERPRISE ZONE COMPENSATION AGREEMENT

This ENTERPRISE ZONE COMPENSATION AGREEMENT (hereinafter referred to as the "COMPENSATION AGREEMENT") made and entered into by and among the Ada Exempted Village School District, Apollo Career Center School District, Hardin County Commissioners and Wilson Sporting Goods Co. specifies the sole manner of making and terms of compensation payments to the school districts in lieu of receiving real property tax based upon the value of the real property listed in Exhibit A (a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference).

WHEREAS, the Ohio Enterprise Zone Act under Ohio Revised Code (hereinafter "O.R.C.")

Sections 5709.61 through 5709.69 authorizes counties, with the consent and agreement of affected municipalities and townships therein, to designate areas as Enterprise Zones and to execute agreements with certain enterprises for the purpose of establishing, expanding, renovating or occupying facilities and hiring new employees and preserving jobs within said zones in exchange for specified local tax incentives granted by the municipality, township and county; and

WHEREAS, the Ada Exempted Village School District and the Apollo Career Center School District have been provided a copy of the requirements of the Ohio Enterprise Zone Program, including the notice and meeting provisions (O.R.C. Section 5709.83), revenue sharing requirements (O.R.C. Section 5709.82), participation in the Tax Incentive Review Council requirement (O.R.C. Section 5709.85) annual reporting requirements (O.R.C. Section 5709.68), and approvals required on specific projects exceeding this stated incentive level (O.R.C. Section 5709.63); and

WHEREAS, the Ada Village Council has acted pursuant to O.R.C. Section 5709.63 by passing
Resolution No, adopted, 2023; and the Board of Commissioners of
Hardin County have acted by passing Resolution No, adopted, 2023,
to grant a one hundred percent (100%) real property tax exemption for fifteen (15) years to
Wilson Sporting Goods Co. and entered into a formal Enterprise Zone Agreement on
, 2023; and
WHEREAS, pursuant to O.R.C. Section 5709.82, the Ada Exempted Village School District and
Apollo Career Center School District and Wilson Sporting Goods Co. desire to enter into a
COMPENSATION AGREEMENT concerning the benefits relating to the aforementioned
"PROJECT."
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual promises, covenants
and agreements hereinafter set forth, the Ada Exempted Village School District and the Apollo
Career Center School District, the Hardin County Commissioners and Wilson Sporting Goods

SECTION 1. Definitions, in the Agreement, as used and set forth below shall have the following meaning:

Co. as follows:

A. "PARTICIPATING ENTITIES" and/or "SIGNEES" shall mean the ADA EXEMPTED VILLAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as the "SCHOOL"), with its offices located at 725 West North Avenue, Ada, Ohio 45810, the APOLLO CAREER CENTER SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter referred to as "APOLLO"), with its offices located at 3325 Shawnee Road, Lima, Ohio 45806, the HARDIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS (hereinafter referred to as the "COUNTY") with offices located at One Courthouse Square, Kenton, Ohio, 43326, the ENTERPRISE ZONE

- ADMINISTRATOR (hereinafter referred to as the "EZA"), Hardin County Chamber and Business Alliance, with offices located at 225 South Detroit Street, Kenton, Ohio 43326, and WILSON SPORTING GOODS CO. (hereinafter referred to as "WILSON"), with its main offices located at 217 Liberty Street, Ada, Ohio 45810.
- B. "EZ AGREEMENT" shall mean the Enterprise Zone Agreement entered into by (1) the COUNTY, (2) Ada Village Council ("COUNCIL"), and (3) WILSON.
- C. "PROJECT" shall mean the new manufacturing facility of WILSON located at East Highland Avenue, Ada relating to and as set forth in the Enterprise Zone Agreement and the creation of new jobs at that location.
- D. "EXEMPTION YEAR" shall mean any real property tax return year in which the PROJECT is receiving real property tax forgiveness under the aforementioned EZ AGREEMENT pursuant to O.R.C. Sections 5709.62 and/or 5709.63.
- E. ANNUAL PAYMENT AMOUNT (hereinafter referred to as "PAYMENT AMOUNT") shall mean the amount paid by WILSON SPORTING GOODS to the SCHOOL and APOLLO through the EZA (with the approval of the COUNTY) in lieu of real property taxes. This PAYMENT AMOUNT shall be paid to the SCHOOL and APOLLO, as determined by the SIGNEES and the Hardin County Auditor's Office.

SECTION 2. Compensation Annual Payment Review.

Evidence shall be provided by the EZA, to the COUNTY, the SCHOOL, and APOLLO of the manner in which the annual PAYMENT AMOUNT is calculated at the time this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT and the EZ AGREEMENT are executed. The parties agree that these payments will be reviewed not later than March 31st of each year the EZ AGREEMENT is in effect by the Ada Tax Incentive Review Council. The

parties to this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT further agree that the amount of the PAYMENT AMOUNTS shall not increase or decrease but are fixed for the life of the COMPENSATION AGREEMENT. In the event it becomes more advantageous for all parties involved to treat these PAYMENT AMOUNTS in a specific manner, or to have the PAYMENT AMOUNTS designated or made in some other way, the SCHOOL, APOLLO and WILSON agree to take all reasonable steps to accommodate all the parties involved in this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT.

SECTION 3. Compensation Annual Payment

During each EXEMPTION YEAR in which WILSON receives a real property tax benefit pursuant to the EZ AGREEMENT, WILSON shall pay the SCHOOL and APOLLO, respectively, through the EZA, an annual PAYMENT AMOUNT as set forth in the attached EXHIBIT A, copies of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The calculation of the PAYMENT AMOUNT equals the total sum of the SCHOOL and APOLLO portion of real property taxes for the new real property put into service after the effective date of the EZ AGREEMENT and within the expansion period provided therein, for the PROJECT attributed to the operating millage amount only, had those new real property taxes been collected by the Hardin County Treasurer, for the term of the exemption multiplied by twenty-five percent (25%) and divided between the SCHOOL and APOLLO as set forth on attached EXHIBIT A by the number of years in the exemption period. With respect to investments that commence with TAX YEAR 2024, the EXEMPTION shall not extend beyond TAX YEAR 2038.

SECTION 4. Compensation Payment Schedule

During each EXEMPTION YEAR relating to the PROJECT, WILSON shall pay the SCHOOL and APOLLO through the EZA an annual PAYMENT AMOUNT on or before July 15th of each year of the EZ AGREEMENT and COMPENSATION

AGREEMENT as set for in EXHIBIT A. The first PAYMENT AMOUNT will commence in the year in which real property taxes attributable to the PROJECT property would have been payable, were that property not exempted from taxation.

PAYMENT AMOUNTS for said compensation will begin and be collected by July 15, 2026 and will cease on or by July 15, 2041. There will be a grace period of sixteen (16) days within which the payment must have been made (not later than July 31st), in order to avoid default notification stated in Section 9 of this COMPENSATION

AGREEMENT.

SECTION 5. Place of Payments

COMPENSATION PAYMENTS to the SCHOOL and APOLLO shall be payable to the SCHOOL and APOLLO, sent to the EZA, for the purpose of monitoring the terms of this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT. EZA will then report to the COUNTY and then forward said payments to the SCHOOL and APOLLO respectively.

SECTION 6. Tax Incentive Review Council Annual Meeting

WILSON shall participate in an annual Tax Incentive Review Council meeting with all affected taxing authorities or SIGNEES. This meeting shall be held prior to March 31st of each year relating to the aforementioned PROJECT.

SECTION 7. County and State Reporting Requirements

WILSON shall file with the EZA copies of all State of Ohio Enterprise Zone requirement forms. WILSON shall also file with the Hardin County Auditor and the

State of Ohio real property tax forms (e.g., DTE Form 24) for each year WILSON receives benefits under the EZ AGREEMENT.

SECTION 8. Income Tax Revenue Sharing

Pursuant to O.R.C. Section 5709.82, **SIGNEES** agree that the municipal income and/or payroll taxes generated as a result of jobs created relating to the **PROJECT** shall <u>not</u> be shared with the **SCHOOL** or **APOLLO**.

SECTION 9. Defaults and Remedies

Exemptions from taxation of real property taxes granted under the EZ AGREEMENT by the COUNCIL and the COUNTY shall be reviewed annually (Tax Years 2024-2038) by the Ada Tax Incentive Review Committee and participating SIGNEES. In the event of a default by WILSON, a late COMPENSATION AGREEMENT payment after July 15th and not made by July 31st of each EXEMPTION YEAR or a discrepancy of payment by WILSON, all PARTICIPATING PARTIES of this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT shall be notified in writing by the EZA within five (5) working days after the last day of July of the occurrence. If it is determined by the COUNTY and the EZA that WILSON has violated the EZ AGREEMENT or this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT, the EZ AGREEMENT and/or this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT may be modified or revoked and the actual amount of abated taxes relating to the PROJECT shall be certified by the Hardin County Auditor and placed upon the tax duplicate. Compensation paid to the SCHOOL and APOLLO as donations will continue to be viewed as donations and the full amount of unpaid tax for each year will be due from WILSON, less the amount of the compensation payments to the SCHOOL and/or APOLLO.

SECTION 10. Amendments

This **COMPENSATION AGREEMENT** may not be amended or modified without the written consent of all the parties hereto.

SECTION 11. Entire Agreement

This COMPENSATION AGREEMENT sets forth the entire agreement and understanding between the parties as the subject matter contained herein and merges and supersedes all prior discussions, agreements and undertakings of every kind and nature between the parties with respect to the matter of this COMPENSATION

AGREEMENT. The SCHOOL and APOLLO, in cooperation with the EZA and the COUNTY, agree to work cooperatively with WILSON to establish resource services relating to WILSON's employment needs.

SECTION 12. Severability of Provisions

The invalidity of any provisions of this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT shall not affect the other provisions of this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT, and this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT shall be constructed in all respects as if any invalid portions were omitted.

SECTION 13. Acts of God

In the event of a catastrophic event (to be determined jointly by the COUNCIL, the COUNTY and the EZA) that would render the real property described in the EZ AGREEMENT unusable/destroyed, this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT will become null and void and any additional pages due after the catastrophic event will be terminated.

SECTION 14. Effect of Possible Change in Ohio Real Property Tax Law

If, as a result of a repeal of, or another significant change to, Ohio real property tax law, which can include other related state or local tax law changes such as the enactment of a new tax and changes in revenue sources for local government entities and the local government entities have authority under the new changes or exiting law to address the matter; and WILSON believes that it has been materially harmed and the SCHOOL and APOLLO have materially benefited, or the SCHOOL and APOLLO believe that they have been materially harmed and WILSON has materially benefited, WILSON, the SCHOOL or APOLLO may give notice to the other parties of their desire to enter into an amendment to this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT or new agreement(s), or both. If such notice is given, the parties shall negotiate in good faith in an attempt to reach a result that is fair and just, legally possible, considering all circumstances, including the parties' reasonable expectations concerning real property tax payments, real property tax receipts and compensation payments at the time and execution of this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT and the EZ AGREEMENT. If the parties are unable to agree to an amendment to this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT or new agreement(s), or both, within one hundred twenty (120) days after notice has been provided by WILSON, the SCHOOL or APOLLO, the parties shall submit this matter to arbitration in a manner similar to the procedure set forth in O.R.C. Section 1332,08.

SECTION 15. Notices

By signing this COMPENSATION AGREEMENT, the SCHOOL and APOLLO waive their respective rights to the forty-five (45) day review period required by O.R.C. Section 5709.63(C)(1)(c). All payments, certificates, reports and notices which are required to or may be given pursuant to the provisions of this agreement shall be sent by regular mail,
